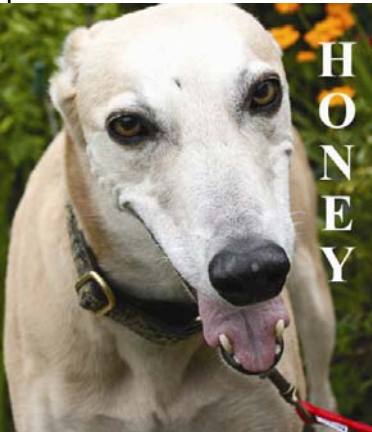
Welcome to our Autumn - Winter 2013 Newsletter

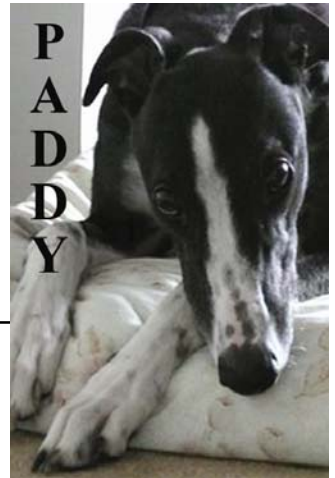
Thank you, from the bottom of our hearts, for making this possible.

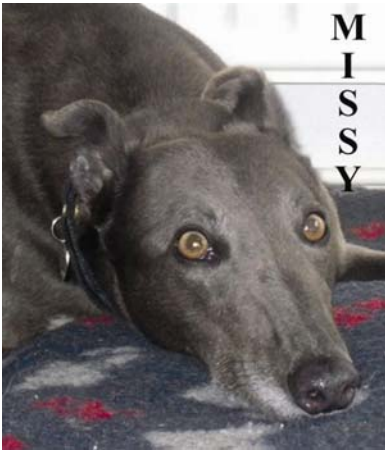

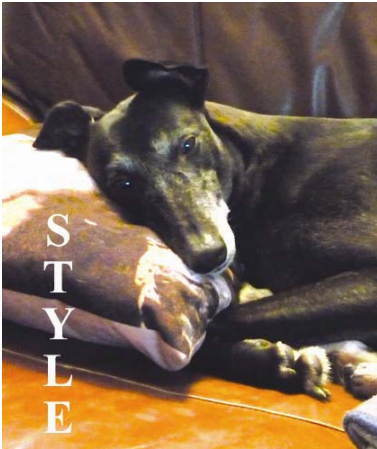

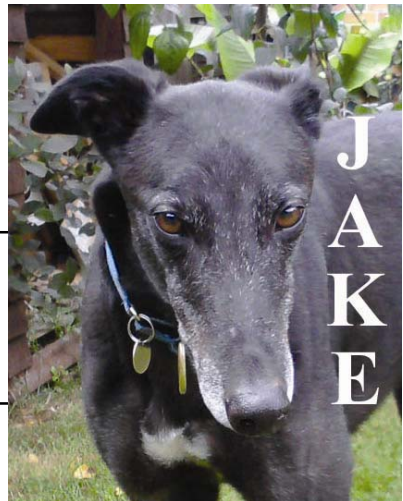
Hounds featured in last newsletter

Update - and a plea for help!

**Welcome to our Autumn /
Winter 2013 newsletter.**

This year has been a year of two parts for us – our homing for the first quarter of the year was very, very slow.

Worrying for us because it means our dogs are waiting in kennels for long

that won't always be the case and we have sadly lost dogs in the past when we simply had nowhere for them to go.

Fortunately, things picked up when the weather improved and lots more of our hounds found their forever homes. Amazingly we have homed 59 dogs so far this year (at time of going to print).

So what can you do? There are two hugely important parts of our organisation. Fundraising and foster homes. Like all rescues, we rely entirely on fund-raising to keep going and carry on saving dogs. We organise collections and Meet 'n' Greets in Norfolk and we have a team in Suffolk doing the same.

But what we also have is individual people raising hundreds of pounds entirely off their own bat. Look at the stories on our fund-raising page! Some people do car boot sales, or hold coffee mornings, or bake cakes to sell at work. What could you do to help? We're all good at something. Please share your ideas with us.

Our foster homes are a vital link in the chain from kennel to forever home. We featured fostering in the last newsletter but the need for more loving foster homes never goes away.

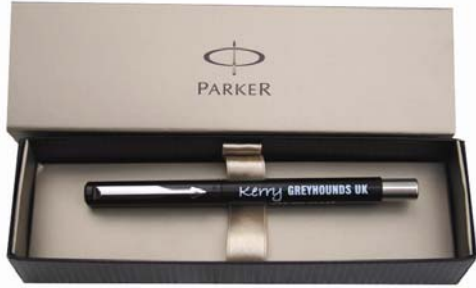

Tedzer – little boy lost!

It must be every dog owner's worst nightmare. Your dog escapes from the garden, he's only been with you a couple of weeks so he doesn't know you, or the area very well at all. It's the end of October, it gets dark quite early and Bonfire Night is on the way.

This is exactly what happened to Tedzer on Friday, October 26th last year. He went missing from his foster home in East Malling in Kent. What made things even worse is that Tedzer is a little bit timid in unfamiliar situations and not the type of dog to approach a stranger. In fact he's more likely to turn tail and run if someone he doesn't know tries to grab him.

We had one or two sightings shortly after he disappeared but then it all went very quiet.

Trying hard to stay optimistic, we registered him on Dog Lost, contacted all the vets and kennels in the area to let them know he was missing and set up a Facebook page. We had hundreds of leaflets and posters printed and volunteers in the area went out to deliver them and look for him.

One of the problems we faced was that Tedzer was lost in Kent and most of our volunteers live in and around Norfolk.

We needed help fast and lots of it!

We called in the cavalry in the form of Kent Greyhound Rescue. These wonderful people turned out in force and organised themselves so that there were people on the ground, in the area where Tedzer had gone missing, all day from dawn until dusk. No matter how cold or wet it was, they went out every day to try and find him. Two of our own very dedicated volunteers – Pete and Derek – travelled from Norfolk to Kent to help with the search.

By Sunday he had been missing for three days. It was cold and got even colder overnight.

We needed some very special help.

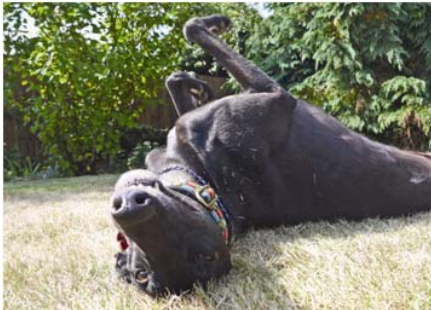
Cue Jenny Brown and her super tracker dog Tiga.

Jenny is a volunteer with Dog Lost and she and Tiga have successfully helped to find other lost dogs using Tiga's amazing tracking abilities.

Tiga used one of Tedzer's beds to get his scent and was able to let Jenny know which area to keep searching. This was what we needed to know and with fresh heart, our volunteers kept on looking, concentrating their efforts on a large industrial estate.

On Wednesday October 31st, Tedzer was finally spotted hiding in a patch of brambles. He was so frightened he was literally frozen with fear and a volunteer from Kent Greyhound Rescue was able to squeeze into the brambles and scoop him up to safety.

Not all searches for lost dogs have such a happy ending. We, and Tedzer, were so very lucky that he was found safe and well, if a bit thin and hungry. Huge thanks to Kent Greyhound Rescue for their efforts above and beyond the call of duty, and of course to Jenny and Tiga for saving the day again.



Tedzer travelled to a foster home in Norfolk to recover from his ordeal. He was very thin, and very frightened.

It took him a little while to settle in but ten months down the line he's a happy, playful, cheeky little chap with a very shiny coat and a real thing for tennis balls.

And best of all – his foster family absolutely fell in love with him and

couldn't bear to part with him. Welcome home at last Tedzer xxx

Our very special 'Hidden Hounds'

We want to tell you about our 'hidden hounds'. We don't have many – sometimes not even one - but at the moment we have three. These are hounds that have come into our care but are not ready yet for new homes. You won't see them on the website, or the Facebook page, but they are living quietly with one of our foster families, learning about humans and about trust. The hidden hounds we are caring for at the moment are Evie, Sophie and Lexie. Three little girls who all needed a special place to go. Evie has been in her foster home for nearly 2 years, Sophie for 7 months and Lexie for just 6 weeks.

Lexie was one of the 'Hartlepool 12' that you can read about on the next page. When we tried to put her in our van to bring her to Norfolk, she was so scared that she wet herself. We don't know what has happened to her, but we believe that she has had very little contact with people at all and is just petrified of them. Lexie is a black girl, just 2 years old.

We put her straight into an experienced foster home where she has 3 other dogs for company and we left her alone. Believe it or not, this is exactly what nervous and timid dogs need – to be completely ignored. It lets them blend into the background and takes all the pressure of human contact away. Six weeks on, Lexie is making steady progress. She will play with the resident dogs, and has started 'stealing' things to keep in her bed (usually cushions, slippers or shoes). She joins her foster family in the lounge now instead of hiding in her crate, and she can go for short, quiet walks. She still doesn't want to be touched or stroked, but given time she will learn that people can be kind and will come and interact voluntarily with her fosterers.

The story of the ‘Hartlepool 12’

We love Facebook! Our auctions have raised a huge amount for us and have kept us going over a very difficult winter. But Facebook plays another vital role. It’s an invaluable resource for rescues and rescuers around the world. Dogs in desperate need can be shared and their details seen by thousands of people. So many have been saved.

It was through Facebook that we heard about twelve dogs at risk in Hartlepool. These dogs (a mixture of males and females) were living loose in a barn. They were fighting for their share of the food and supplementing their meagre diet by catching pigeons that were foolish enough to venture in. Of course 10 of the 12 dogs were also black – the hardest colour to home.

Our van can only transport 10 dogs at a time. Our volunteers spent hours on the phone, trying to find a way to get all 12 of these dogs to safety. We had no intention of leaving any of them behind. Alice (3), Lass (7), Cutler (4), Tiger (4), Lucy (4), Jess (4), Michelle (6), Max (4), Jenga (8), Blackie (4), Lexie (2) and Romeo (4) would be rescued.

With help from Lucille Cavadino (a volunteer with Lancky Hounds who raises money to help greyhounds in the North of England) we put a plan together.

Lucy and Lass went to Greenfield Greyhound Rescue in Staffordshire, which meant we could get everyone else into our big red van.

Fenbank Greyhound Sanctuary in Lincolnshire agreed to take Jess and Michelle.
